SEATTLE ARTS & LECTURES ANNOUNCES 2020/21 YOUTH POET LAUREATE BITANIYA GIDAY TO PUBLISH HER FIRST BOOK IN JUNE 2021

An exclusive online-only interview and reading featuring Bitaniya will stream on Friday, May 28 at 3 p.m. (PT) at Northwest Folklife Festival

Seattle, WA—May 28, 2021: <u>Seattle Arts & Lectures</u> (SAL) is thrilled to announce the June 2021 release of *Motherland*, the first collection of poetry by the 2020/21 Seattle Youth Poet Laureate, Bitaniya Giday, published by <u>Poetry NW Editions</u>. This week, in a pre-recorded online event as part of the <u>2021 Folk Life Festival</u>, Bitaniya will answer questions regarding her inspirations, her approach towards poetry, and how her writing has evolved throughout the publication process. This event will also reveal the 2021/22 Seattle Youth Poet Laureate and debut the full 2021/22 Youth Poet Laureate cohort on <u>lectures.org</u>.

Bitaniya Giday became the Seattle Youth Poet Laureate in spring of 2020—a time of incredible national trauma and unrest. Her poetry collection, *Motherland*, invites us to interrogate the identities and stories we quietly carry, and explores the complex processes of identification, reconciliation, grief, and healing.

Bitaniya Giday is a first-generation Ethiopian American residing in Seattle. Her writing explores the nuances of womanhood and Blackness, as she reflects upon her family's path of immigration across the world. She hopes to restore and safeguard the past, present, and future histories of her people through traditional storytelling and poetry.

Motherland is currently being printed and will be available to order in June.
