SEATTLE ARTS & LECTURES ANNOUNCES 2021/22 YOUTH POET LAUREATE ZINNIA HANSEN'S BOOK RELEASE A reading celebrating Zinnia Hansen and the 2022/23 Youth Poet Laureate Cohort took place on Saturday, May 28 at 11 a.m. at Northwest Folklife Festival

Seattle, WA—JUNE 14, 2022: <u>Seattle Arts & Lectures</u> (SAL) is thrilled to announce the release of *Spikenard*, the first collection of poetry by the 2021/22 Seattle Youth Poet Laureate, Zinnia Hansen, published by <u>Poetry</u> <u>NW Editions</u>. At an in-person event that was part of the <u>2022 Folklife</u> <u>Festival</u>, Hansen read from her new book alongside the 2022/23 Youth Poet Laureate (YPL) Cohort Members.

Hansen became the Seattle Youth Poet Laureate in spring of 2021—a time of deep reflection and careful transformation. Youth Poet Laureate Mentors Laura Da' and Arianne True guided Hansen through the process of publishing, drawing from their own experiences. Her poetry collection, *Spikenard*, invites us to unearth the holiness of our rituals, and questions how, why, and to whom we pray. Love emerges as central to this work, just as the rose emerges from the moon in the cover art by the author's grandmother, Toni Ann Rust.

Zinnia Hansen is a poet and essayist from the Pacific Northwest, studying at the University of Washington. Her work has been published in various magazines and online publications, including *Rattle*. She was a finalist in the *New York Times* Personal Narrative Contest and part of the Hugo House Young Poet's Cohort.

Laura Da' is a poet and teacher. A lifetime resident of the Pacific Northwest, Da' studied creative writing at the University of Washington and the Institute of American Indian Arts. She is Eastern Shawnee. Her first book, *Tributaries*, was published by the University of Arizona Press and won a 2016 American Book Award. Da' has held residencies at the Richard Hugo House, Tin House, and Jack Straw. Her newest book, *Instruments of the True Measure*, is the winner of the Washington State Book Award. Da' lives near Seattle with her husband and son.

Arianne True (Choctaw, Chickasaw) is a queer poet and folk artist from Seattle. She teaches and mentors youth poets around Puget Sound and moonlights as a copyeditor. True has received fellowships from Jack Straw, the Hugo House, and Artist Trust, and is a proud alum of Hedgebrook and of the MFA program at the Institute of American Indian Arts. She is currently the Seattle Repertory Theater's first Native Artist-in-Residence.
