Dear Friends.

Last June, Seattle Arts & Lectures closed our 37th season with a sold-out event with Ocean Vuong, author of the bestselling novel *Emperor of Gladness*. The packed hall buzzed in anticipation as folks chatted, waiting to see the author.

However, the evening quickly became about authors, plural, as we began the program by introducing a student poet from our Writers in the Schools program. If you have attended our events, you know this is a much-beloved ritual which twines together our Youth Programs and Public Programs, giving a youth poet the stage and a moment to shine.

That evening's featured youth poet was Pheakday Yim from the Seattle World School, a culturally and linguistically diverse Seattle Public School for newcomer secondary students. As Yim read his original poem, "My Frustrated Body," Ocean Vuong watched backstage—just as riveted as the audience. At the end, the entire hall joyfully erupted to give Yim a standing ovation.

This moment of expansion, of connection, of delight—even of slight upending of expectation—was just one of so many moments of transformation that occurred last year.

And it could not have happened without you.

Many SAL authors have noted over the years that when you read their work, it is an act of co-creation. So too is the shared endeavor of the work of SAL. We could not have written the story of last year without you. Thank you.

With your support, we co-created WITS programs at 39 schools and hospital sites, serving more than 6,000 public school students. Students who write their stories through WITS feel heard and feel seen. They report feeling greater self-confidence in all their work. They begin to engage more deeply in school and in their community. They become authors of their own lives.

With your help, we connected people to ideas and each other through author events like Ocean's, book programs like Summer Book Bingo, free reading parties, book clubs with partner bookstores, our podcast, and more. Readers who engage in SAL's Public Programs feel less isolated, are more likely to read diversely, read for pleasure, volunteer, and engage in the civic life of their community. Whether it was in the space of a classroom, the space of a hall, or an online space, together last year we held space—for stories that connected us, challenged us, and changed us.

With you, we had the best Words Bloom: SAL Gala of all time, exceeding our goal and raising almost \$200k more than the year before! The community support for SAL was in full bloom this year, and it showed. I am proud to say that we expanded our staff, our budget, and ended last year solidly in the black.

These are difficult times, times when community must come together like never before. In a time of misinformation and censorship, SAL will continue to uplift diverse stories and true tales—both from the best nationally known writers of our time and from the young people in our public schools.

In an era of fraying civil discourse, SAL will continue to build our community's capacity for creative and critical conversations. In a world that increasingly seeks to fracture our attention with algorithms, SAL will maintain our commitment to deep attention, to presence, and to attending. SAL will work to change the narrative for kids and adults who want to write a better world together—a kinder world, a more empathetic world.

We are here to continue to serve readers and writers, and those who might be. We are here to be human together. Thank you for bringing words into the world with us. We couldn't cocreate this story without you.




