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SEATTLE ARTS & LECTURES ANNOUNCES INDIGENOUS LITERATURE AND LAND-BASED PEDAGOGY WORKSHOP WITH LAURA DA'

Online Professional Development for Educators and Teaching Artists on Thursday, November 18, at 4 p.m. (PT)

Seattle, WA—NOVEMBER 3, 2021: <u>Seattle Arts & Lectures</u> (SAL) announced a workshop taught by Laura Da', WITS Writer and Youth Poet Laureate Mentor. <u>Patterns of Air: Pathways for Indigenous Inspiration</u>, <u>Literacy, and Creativity</u> is the second module of a four-part, ongoing professional development series for educators and teaching artists. Washington State Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) Clock Hours are available for eligible participants.

Patterns of Air: Pathways for Indigenous Inspiration, Literacy, and Creativity is designed to offer practical, open-source content and strategies for teaching writing that is suitable for different age levels and all students. The workshop will include an open discussion about how to incorporate more Indigenous literacy—both in example texts and in ways of understanding and expressing knowledge in the classroom—with an emphasis on the natural world and place-based learning.

Laura Da' is a poet and teacher. A lifetime resident of the Pacific Northwest, Da' studied creative writing at the University of Washington and The Institute of American Indian Arts. Da' is Eastern Shawnee. She is the author of *Tributaries*, winner of the American Book Award, and *Instruments of the True Measure*, winner of the Washington State Book Award.

Each workshop module will include a bundle of teaching resources, including suggested readings, activities, thinking strategies, engagement

techniques, and culturally responsive standards alignment. Additionally, each professional development module will address one institutional challenge and pose thinking and strategies to address it. This two-hour workshop will fulfill OSPI's Continuing Education Clock Hours (2) for all state educators, and meets the requirements for ongoing Racial Equity Training for teacher certification.
