STEP 1

STEP 2

Get a Bingo or a Blackout

BINGO: Complete a horizontal, vertical, or diagonal line! Turn in your card and you'll be entered into a drawing for a \$30 gift card to an independent bookstore.

BLACKOUT: Complete all 25 squares! Turn in your card and you'll be entered in a drawing for the grand prize – a **\$100 gift card** to an independent book store. All blackout cards are also entered into Bingo drawing.

STEP 3

Submit your completed card (with either a bingo or a blackout) in one of the following ways:
